

- 52 definition of miniatures – 6 Prime Elements of Judging reviewed individually
- 54 sepals may be skillfully trimmed if their size, even though normal for a specific variety, is distracting. However, total removal of the sepals produces an unnatural appearing specimen and should be penalized.
- 55 some show schedules provide classes for “micro-mini”. This is a nonofficial, subjective term, and, if used, it is incumbent upon the schedule writer to define for the judge and the exhibitor what they mean. In any case, the judge’s decision on size must be governed by that which is typical of the variety.
- 58 only those varieties classified as Large-flowered climbers, climbing hybrid teas, and hybrid wichuranas are to be exhibited in the climber class. Those varieties that have a bush counterpart (hybrid tea, floribunda, miniature, etc.) are exhibited in the same class as their bush counterpart. Example: Peace, Cl. - Dainty Bess, Cl. - Playgirl, Cl.
- 59 Climbers & hybrid wichurana - detailed application of the six prime elements of judging.
- 62 Note: The rambler class has been eliminated, most ramblers have been reassigned to hybrid multiflora (OGR) or wichurana (climber) classes.

- 64 definition – species
- 65 all such stem-on-stem conditions are permitted in exhibiting species OGR’s and shrubs.
- (68) genesis award – best blue-ribbon winning species rose
- 69 definition – shrub rose
- 70 best shrub award or best classic shrub & best modern shrub award
classic shrubs = hybrid kordesii, hybrid moyesii, hybrid musk, or
hybrid rugosa
modern shrub = shrub (S)

Changes In The Guidelines For Judging Roses
1993 vs. 2003

Most chapters have been rearranged and reassigned...example: chapter 14 (1993) became Chapter 1 (2003).

Page:	Change:
III / IV	list of the District Chairmen of Judges
9 – 10	improperly named roses – any rose that have been entered in a show with a name that has not been recognized by the ARS must be disqualified. Roses are to be exhibited by the recognized ARS exhibition name (AEN).
11	<u>species</u> may be exhibited stem on stem along with OGR & shrubs.
11	foreign substance – cotton balls or other material to hold petals in place, In other words, anything added to the specimen, stem, or foliage is cause for disqualification. This disqualification also applies to exhibition aids accidentally left in or on the exhibit.
16	violation of show rules – if the schedule specifies which wedging material are permissible, wedges of any other kind are cause for disqualification.
21	of the six prime elements of judging a rose specimen, the only element that does not consider the bloom is stem & foliage.
23	one “rule of thumb” states the stem length should be approximately six times the height of the bloom. This holds true for large roses and miniatures.
23	however, size alone should not sway a judge into ignoring the other important elements in judging the rose.
24	definition – grandiflora.
25 & 28	to view the profile it is permissible to raise the bloom to eye level, turning the vase and specimen with the vase as the pivotal point. <u>The bloom itself must never be touched in any way for any reason.</u>
36	climbing hybrid teas <u>without</u> a bush counterpart are exhibited in the climber class...examples: Aloha & High Noon.
37	definition – floribunda & polyantha
